

PROJECT BRIEF

Prague is divided into twenty two unique self governing districts. Each district is respectively possess their own unique identity. The chosen site, Prague 7 is selected as a buffer zone to prevent more urban sprawls happening through Prague 8. The site is located in the heart of Prague 7. The project aims to revitalize the brownfields and create a landscape which Prague 7 neighbours can benefit from. Prague 7 has a very distinctive urban pattern as several sport facilities are splitted inside of it without having any connection. For this reason, an Olympic Park Masterplan is proposed to revitalize the brownfields and create a landscape for the neighbours as it maintains connectivity between current facilities while introducing new ones. Stragetically, using existing sports facilities will help Prague to use Olympics funds more on creating landscape than building new facilities. The Olympic masterplan is seen as a strategy to create LEED Neighborhood Development by taking into account walkability, healthy streets, transit-oriented development and smart growth strageties. In order to make this masterplan durable and flexible for post-occupancy, a transformation plan is developed, Legacy Mode 2040. Legacy Mode 2040 masterplan aims to transform Olympic Masterplan into a university campus which will have its high-class sports facilities and landscape which Prague 7 seeks to have. In this way, the masterplan focuses on modular phase strategies.
